


















To Meet Student Needs


















D.A.R.

In the metal division of the Industrial Arts Award Winners was Paul Cassell who won the sweepstakes. His project was also selected as the best in all areas.



Outstanding Teenagers of America



The Outstanding Teenagers of America annual awards program is sponsored by the non-profit Outstanding Americans Foundation. The Foundation, dedicated to honoring, inspiring, and encouraging young people to take full advantage of the opportunities in America, offers this program to nationally recognize the ability of youth. The program begins on the high school level where the principal nominates three outstanding teenagers, awarding them a special certificate. Betty Crocker Award

The Betty Crocker Search for the Homemaker of Tomorrow is an educational and scholarship program in which all senior girls are eligible. Awards are based on the 50-minute Knowledge and Attitude test which consists of objective questions dealing with basic homemaking skills and other important aspects of homemaking; family budgeting, buying and furnishing a home, child care and training, participation in community life. 




Cross Country




Wrestlers in Action
